## PROGRAM OVERVIEW

Under **Adopt A Granny** initiative, SJS has identified about **100 domestic workers** who are above the **age of 65** and lack adequate family support for their **sustenance**.

SJS will ensure that all contributions go directly to the grannies. A report card on the health and status of the adopted grannies and how the contributions were utilized will be published biannually and will be made available to all the contributors.




\*The scheme details are indicative in nature. SJS based on need on the ground, will allocate resources to areas (food, medical or shelter of the grannies) that most need the funds.

SJS was founded in the early 80s to protest against the biased judgement in the rape case of Mathura- the Adivasi girl.

In the early years, SJS represented the most deprived sections: women domestic labour, construction workers and garment manufacturing workers, covering thousands of families.



Over the recent years, SJS has focused on the rights of domestic workers empowering thousands of them to lead a better life.

Geeta Menon, a women's rights activist, co-founded **SJS** in the early 80s. Ever since she has been the voice of the toiling and marginalised women, fighting for their identity and dignity.
